RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the annual meeting of the Town of Weathersfield voted on March 4th, 2003, to be considered "*a rural town for the purpose of adopting, amending, or repealing zoning bylaws;*" and

WHEREAS, Title 24, Section 4442 (c) (2), of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, now permits routine adoption, amendment and repeal of zoning bylaws by majority vote of the legislative body at a meeting that is held after the final public hearings; and

WHEREAS, Title 24, Section 4442 (c) (2), of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, now permits the legislative body of a rural town, by its own action, to elect to require that zoning bylaw amendments or repeals be adopted by the vote of the Town, by Australian ballot, at a special or regular town meeting duly warned on the issue; and

WHEREAS, that procedure shall then apply until rescinded by the voters at a regular or special meeting of the Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT,

1. The Weathersfield Select Board hereby elects to require that zoning bylaw amendments or repeals shall be adopted by vote of the Town of Weathersfield, by Australian ballot, at a special or regular Town meeting duly warned on the issue; and
2. This procedure shall apply until rescinded by the voters of the Town of Weathersfield at a regular or special Town meeting duly warned on the issue.
